Michelin Guide Book – Tokyo is the culinary capital of the world

With the release of the Michelin Guide in 2008, Tokyo has been recognized as a shining star in the world of cuisine. Michelin's Tokyo Guide awarded 191 stars to 150 restaurants in the capital city of Japan, the highest number of stars awarded in any city. Paris previously held the top spot, with only 65 stars. Eight establishments in Tokyo, three French restaurants, two sushi bars and three traditional Japanese restaurants, received Michelin's highest rating of 3 stars.



According to Michelin, a team of three undercover European and two Japanese inspectors spent a year and a half visiting 1,500 of Tokyo's estimated 160,000 restaurants to decide on the ratings. The guidebook rates restaurants on excellence in cooking, service, décor and upkeep.

The announcement by the Michelin Guide was treated as front-page news and was broadcast widely on TV. The glowing reviews for Tokyo's restaurants was also seen as confirmation of the value of something that the Japanese have long seen as a source of national pride – the mastery of sushi, sashimi and all the other famously subtle elements of Japan's indigenous cuisine. The guide sold 120,000 copies in just three days.

Tokyo Taste - The World Summit of Gastronomy



February 9 - 11, 2009, Tokyo International Forum

This is the first international culinary event in Asia. Top chefs from across the world will gather in Tokyo to demonstrate their latest culinary creations and share ideas based on their home country's cuisine. At the same time, the Summit features the latest culinary trends in Japan and will promote Japanese cuisine to the rest of the world. This event also highlights the relationship between food and nutritional sciences. A portion of the Summit's proceeds will be donated towards food relief for impoverished children around the world.

Starting from 10,000 yen (about \$100 Canadian dollars) per day, the admission covers multiple lectures and demonstrations by prominent chefs. The 60th Sapporo Snow Festival - February 5 to 11, 2009



The Sapporo Snow Festival is one of Japan's largest winter events and each year attracts a growing number of visitors from both Japan and abroad. Every winter, about two million people come to Sapporo to see Odori Park, the grounds at the Community Dome Tsudome and are filled with hundreds of beautiful snow statues and ice sculptures. For seven days in February, these statues and sculptures in a variety of different sizes turn Sapporo

into a winter dreamland of crystal-like ice and white snow.

The Snow Festival began in 1950, when local high school students built six snow statues in Odori Park. In 1955, the Self-Defense Force joined in and built the very first massive snow sculpture. These giant constructions have become the hallmark of the Snow Festival. The Festival has grown from these humble beginnings to become one of the biggest and most well known of Hokkaido's winter events. The Snow Festival is considered to be a festival of international caliber.

The new Tokai-Hokuriku Expressway was completed last month

December 2008 saw the completion of the new Tokai-Hokuriku Expressway which has opened a link between Takayama City and the UNESCO World Heritage site Shirakawa-go. Travel from Toyama Prefecture and Ishikawa Prefecture into the Takayama area will now be faster and more reliable than ever. The trip from Takayama to Shirakawa-go along the narrow mountain road route which could take over 60 minutes is now a safe and speedy 45 minute drive on the multilane expressway route. Another benefit of the new expressway link is that groups traveling to Shirakawa-go during the beautiful but snowy winter months no longer have to worry about being snowed in, which caused delays. The highway buses from the Bus Center in Takayama City are also taking advantage of the new route with revised timetables and a new stop in Shirakawa-go along the route to Kanazawa City in Ishikawa Prefecture. The "Nohi Bus", provides bus transportation in the Hida Takayama area and has established an English website for foreign visitors.
